About Wagga Wagga

Wagga Wagga is the largest inland city in New South Wales and is considered the main commercial and administrative centre in the Riverina region, situated half way between Sydney and Melbourne on the Hume Highway.

Wagga Wagga, located on the banks of the Murrumbidgee River with a population of 69,000. 'Wagga', as it is known to the locals, is a city of fine buildings, tree-lined streets, excellent museums and galleries, parks and gardens, sporting and recreation facilities, diversity of restaurants, and mental wellness facilities.

The city's appeal lies in its diversity. The community is blessed with an ever growing number of people from a variety of ethnic backgrounds.

The cultural, educational and economic life of Wagga is greatly enhanced by but not limited to: Kapooka Army Base, Forest Hill Airforce Base, Charles Sturt University (including St Martin's - an Anglican residential college), TAFE, The Riverina

Anglican College (TRAC), a Christian College, two Catholic High Schools, three state high schools, a number of primary schools (denominational and public), Wagga Base and Calvary Hospitals, and the Riverina Conservatorium of Music. There are areas within the city bounds that are affluent and areas of poverty.

It is a city of sports, gardens and cultural activities, surrounded by rich rural lands, where one can swim in Murrumbidgee; walk along an Aboriginal visit impressive galleries museums including the National Art glass Gallery; have fun at a boutique brewery; admire truly impressive historic buildings and parks; and engage with the Riverside Precinct - the premier entertaining area for the city.



Location and Demographics

The parish currently draws its members from the wider Wagga Wagga region

The Wagga Wagga City Council Local Government Area lists a population of 67,609 in the 2021 Census with an estimated growth to approximately 69,000 in 2023. Due to COVID, a number of people have relocated from capital cities to Wagga Wagga.

There are two Anglican Parishes within the Wagga Wagga LGA – The Anglican Parish of Wagga Wagga (the focus of this profile, also referred to as Wagga Anglican – https://www.anglican.org.au) and the South Wagga Anglican Church (https://swac.church) Wagga Anglican works closely with Anglicare (https://www.anglicare.com.au) who are collocated in the St John's office and in the Ashmont Community Resource Centre (Anglican Community of the Redeemer https://www.facebook.com/ashmontcommunityresourcecentre/).

Historically the primary catchment area for the Anglican Parish of Wagga Wagga has been described as the area north of the railway line which crosses the city, east-west and approximately encompasses approximately a population of 32,600 with considerable and rapid growth in the northern suburbs of Estella, Gobbagombalin and Boorooma, This growth area houses The Riverina Anglican College (https://trac.nsw.edu.au) as well as St Martin's College (https://stmartinscollege.org) within the Charles Sturt University (https://csu.edu.au) There are five churches/centres of worship within the Wagga Parish – St John's, St Luke's, St Saviour's, Anglican Community of the Redeemer and the Wagga Family Service @ TRAC .

Ethnicity: The catchment is increasingly multicultural with the vast majority of residents born in Australia, though this is changing with an ever increasing number of people moving to Wagga from a variety of ethnic backgrounds. There is sharp discrepancy of social disadvantage with some areas having significant numbers of disadvantaged people while other areas are more affluent.

Employment: Wagga Wagga has a 64.4% participation rate in the workforce; 60.3% are in full-time work and 30.03% are in part-time work; unemployment is 4.0%; 16/6% of the population is 65 years or more. The city has a good cross section of blue and white collar employment with Kapooka Army and RAAF Base Wagga, and Charles Sturt University. The median income is \$85,176. The Special Activation Precinct an the Intermodal Railway Hub will provide future employment

Religious affiliation: The number of people in the Wagga area allying themselves to Christianity is significantly higher than the state and national average, with 15.3% affiliated with the Anglican faith. With an increase in the number of Baptisms in the parish in recent times, people are reaching out.

We are currently developing exciting new mission in the expanding northern suburbs of Wagga . This mission will incorporate a new preschool that has the potential to reach out to over 200 families in the emerging suburbs. In keeping with the mission of the Anglican Church from its original settlement, the two arms of outreach of the Anglican Church are through education and ministry. This mission will incorporate both with a multipurpose centre in the preschool to enable a church to grow and flourish.

In Ashmont, another suburb in our Parish with our strategic partnership with Anglicare, where we reach out through caring for the underprivileged and vulnerable in our community and provide a centre of worship through the Anglican Community of the Redeemer and our wider church community.

We are continually looking for opportunities to reach out the to the community of Wagga through civic, social and community opportunities.

- The Rector and Parish Council have a shared responsibility for planning and vision with all members encouraged to contribute and present ideas for vision.
- A vibrant and active ministry team play a collaborative role, well supported by the Parish Council, in determining pastoral needs.
- Education and evangelism require inspiration, focus and dedication.
- Mission work, supported by Parish Council is a quarterly focus on Anglicare, ABM, BCA and St Mark's Theological College

In what ways do lay members of the parish take responsibility for aspects of the day-to-day administration of the parish?

- The parish employs a Parish Administrator (PA), Monday to Friday 22hrs per week. It is the PA's responsibility for all things outlined in the covenant with the PA, including the full administrative support of the ministry team
- The parish treasurer is an accountant and oversees in a volunteer capacity all financial management of the parish and its physical resources, supported by a team of parishioners assisting with money counting, data entry and stipend preparation, and some business support services from an external provider.
- Property management is the responsibility of the church wardens in consultation with the Rector
- Committees are in place for: Finance, Property, Opportunity Shop, Fund Raising, Preschools and special working groups as required
- Anglican Community of the Redeemer has a passionate and committed lay ministry team who lead services on alternate Sundays and run a weekly bible study.
- Two devoted parishioners are responsible for the parish archives, taking extraordinary care to ensure the parish's history is maintained, and accessible to all.

Housing

Inspection of house by the Regional Archdeacon has been done - see the image below—four bedrooms, study, two bathrooms plus third toilet, large living dining area, modern kitchen with informal dining area, carport (2), garage (1) on St John's site. Stunning Murrumbidgee River views.

Transport

- New Parish vehicle to be provided (i required)
- All costs associated with the motor vehicle operations and replacement is paid by the parish, the exception is fuel cost when priest is on annual leave
- Stipend sacrifice up to 30% is available

Allowances

- Hospitality allowance up to 5% of stipend currently \$3,835
- Telephone: As in accordance with Diocesan
 Clergy Conditions
- Energy: Parish pays all energy costs
- Conferences, etc: Parish pays cost associated with attendance at Synod, Clergy Conferences, Clergy Spouse Conference, Clergy Retreats
- Estimated annual value of surplus fees:
 1 Wedding (\$325) and 29 Funerals (\$200) in 2022)
- Discretionary Fund (for helping needy) in 2022 is \$1,500.

Supportive care

The parish members are an extremely supportive group who enthusiastically care for their Rector and family. The ministry team is strong and cohesive, at the same time as being few in number and some are quite aged. The Rectory family are welcomed, encouraged and supported in parish activities and embraced by the parish community — our church. Shared hospitality is a strength of the parish and its members and embraces opportunities to break bread. Parish provides resources for professional supervision.

Outline of proposed Maintenance or Improvements

- Through thorough planning and good management of resources, the maintenance of church properties is in good stead.
- Parish Administration Building foyer works to be finalised
- Plans for an increased Anglicare presence onsite to be encouraged, supported and materialised
- An overall St John's site Conservation Management Plan to be embraced and actioned in a timely manner
- The preschools have strategic plans in place which include property improvements and growth across multiple sites
- Enhancement and use of digital technology in ministry and other activities
- The establishment of the St John's Church Building Trust



Final Word

Wagga Anglican has a strong sense of mission and outreach to the city and suburbs of Wagga. St John's Church building is seen as the Anglican Church for the City of Wagga Wagga. The parish supports the provision of a more effective, coordinated and collaborative approach to front line Anglican ministry services for the city; communication between all front line Anglican ministry services as crucial within the city; the need for greater contact and collaboration with Anglican agencies within the city and neighbouring Dioceses; and the parishioner resource base is reducing and sees the need to deliver front line ministry services in a smarter way.
